WHY: The 2021-2022 State Budget includes a \$15Million allocation, championed by Assemblymember Rudy Salas (AD 32) and all the Latino Legislative Caucus that included members like Senator Anna Caballero (SD 12), for the establishment of the Dolores Huerta Peace and Justice Cultural Center. The Peace & Justice Cultural Center will be a multicultural community center complex, covering an entire city block in downtown Bakersfield, which will draw tourists and revitalize small businesses in the area. The Dolores Huerta Foundation has chosen to locate the Peace and Justice cultural center in downtown Bakersfield as part of its long-term commitment to revitalize the Eye St. Corridor. The Self Help Federal Credit Union -- with locations throughout the country -- creates and protects ownership and economic opportunity for all by lending to individuals, small businesses and nonprofits; developing real estate; and promoting fair financial practices. Their Bakersfield branch will be built adjacent to the Peace & Justice

- Distribute over 125,000 masks along with health and financial resources to communities in Kern, Tulare, Fresno and Antelope Valley
- Host 20 health and wellness events for youth to deal with pandemic stressors.
- Host 40 COVID-19 Parent/Guardian support meetings. This resulted in increased access to school meals, equitable school board meeting access, improved interpretation services, and more.
- Hosted and or supported 13 vaccination clinics, vaccinated over 2,000 individuals in partnership with the United Against COVID Coalition
